

DISTRICT (5) 4-H HORSE COUNCIL
Educational Scholarship Program Guidelines
Revised 1/17/06

In an effort to recognize outstanding youth and to increase participation in the 4-H Horse Program, the following guidelines are suggested:

- District (5) 4-H Horse Clubs are eligible to submit a Champion and Reserve Champion Junior and Senior (4 per club) Project Record Book for district judging in November.
- Each club is eligible to submit a junior and senior horse project record book champion and reserve champion winner in time to be judged for the district competition in November.
- \$100 and \$50 scholarships will be presented to the Champion and Reserve Champion winners that can be used to pay for horse camp, district horse show or state horse show fees.
- Each club will also be eligible to submit a secretary record book. Junior and Senior Divisions will be based on the age of the individual 4-Her that prepares the record book (Juniors 13 & under, Seniors 14 & over, as of January 1st of current year) Judging criteria will follow the former LTA Secretary Record Book guidelines and be done during the district competition in November.
- A \$100 and \$50 scholarship will be provided to the Champion and Reserve Champion secretary record book winner in each age division.
- In addition, each organized horse club will be provided (1) district horse camp scholarship, based upon the recommendations of the club leader.
- A \$50 participation incentive award will be presented to the club(s) with the highest percentage of projects books submitted at the county level, based on active club members.
- A \$100 and \$50 Scholarship (payable to the club) will be provided to the Champion and Reserve Champion Scrapbook winner. This can be prepared by the club reporter, historian or by any individual or group of members of an organized 4-H horse club.
- Scholarships will continue based on continuation of funds from the KY Department of Agriculture.
