THREAD PAINTING

April 11th, 9am-4pm

Now is the time to learn how to do that wonderful thread art that everyone admires and swear they can't do. Come join us for a day of how too's and creativeness. It's a learning day so keep it simple, you are learning technique not doing a project. Ideas of what to do???, coloring book drawings, Celtic knots, applique flowers, cubes or cones to learn depth and shadows, simple birds, the sky is the limit but try and keep it simple. This class will be all about technique and how to....not advanced let's win a ribbon. Remember practice makes perfect. First you have to learn what you need to do to practice

SUPPLY LIST

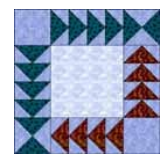
- * 6" or 8" wooden machine embroidery hoops with a screw that can be tightened with a screw driver. These are narrow and will easily slide under the presser foot of the machine-not craft hoops. They cost \$6.50-8.50 depending on the size. If I need to order any just let me know. I prefer to start with the 6" ones as they are easier to start with and work well for most projects unless you are working on a really big embroidery design.
- * Machine that will drop feed dogs and a free motion open toe presser foot or darning foot or darning spring
- * Two or three 10" squares of muslin, and two or three 10" squares of iron-on tearaway stabilizer such as Totally Stable from Sulky.
- * Water soluble marker or # 2 lead pencil
- * Variety of colors of 40 wt. rayon threads, some 30 st. rayon threads (optional). I just want everyone to have a variety of threads to try. (I will try to bring a bags of different threads for everyone to work with). Some metallic and sliver metallic as well. Just bring what you have. 50 or 60 wt. bobbin thread. Sulky brand is the most available and easiest to find and is available in JoAnn Fabrics and Hancock Fabrics.
- * Size 90/14 topstitch needles or embroidery needles work well with these thread types. You might want to bring metallic needles for metallic threads in size 90/14.
